

1. Separate your gun into the stocked action and the barrel with the forend affixed.



2. Release the top lever to the center position to take any tension of the internals.



3. Wrap the barrel in two layers of parchment or newsprint.



4. Wrap the stocked action in two layers of parchment or newsprint.



5. Place the firearm into your case and secure with straps if applicable.



6. Place foam, newspaper, or any soft cushioning material around the gun.



7. Place foam or any cushioning material in the bottom of your outer box.



8. Secure your case and place it into the box. Fill any voids with cushioning material.



9. Fully secure your box and ensure no markings, labels or notes defining that there is a firearm inside, or that the package is being shipped to a firearm dealer.

Best Practice Tips

- Don't send anything that is not explicitly necessary to complete the work required
- Secure any loose items in the case (chokes, tools, screws, etc...).
- Send a copy of your online work order so our staff can quickly process your gun into the gunsmithing queue.
- Ensure your outer box is secured at all ends and is free of tears or dents.

If you are unsure of what you need to send with your gun, please reach out to one of our locations and one of our team members will assist you.
